

ECONOMICS OF URBAN FORESTRY IN COLORADO

Trees have a tremendous impact on local economies and our quality-of-life.

Here's a peek at how urban trees in your state are contributing.



9,738 people are employed as a result of urban forestry activities in Colorado.



Communities in Colorado enrolled in Tree City USA® invested an average of **\$7.84 per**

resident for tree planting and care compared to \$3.00 per

resident in non-participating communities nationally.



Urban trees in the state contribute **\$967 million** in community-wide environmental benefits each year, such as carbon sequestration, air pollution removal, and avoided stormwater runoff.

The urban forestry sector in Colorado has an annual sales and employment footprint

worth \$1.3 billion.



Tree cover at private homes adds

\$365 million annually to property values across Colorado.
