6,956 people are employed as a result of urban forestry activities in Connecticut.



Communities in Connecticut enrolled in Tree City USA® invested an average of **\$7.87 per**

resident for tree planting and
care compared to \$3.00 per

resident in non-participating communities nationally.



Urban trees in the state contribute **\$1.0 billion** in community-wide environmental benefits each year, such as carbon sequestration, air pollution removal, and avoided stormwater runoff.
