

ECONOMICS OF URBAN FORESTRY IN NEW MEXICO

Trees have a tremendous impact on local economies and our quality-of-life. Here's a peek at how urban trees in your state are contributing.



1,697 people are employed as a result of urban forestry activities in New Mexico.



Communities in New Mexico enrolled in Tree City USA® invested an average of \$2.31 per

resident for tree planting and care compared to \$3.00 per

resident in non-participating communities nationally.



Urban trees in the state contribute \$685 million in community-wide environmental benefits each year, such as carbon sequestration, air pollution removal, and avoided stormwater runoff.



The urban forestry sector in New Mexico has an annual sales and employment footprint

worth \$162 million.



Tree cover at private homes adds

\$79 million annually to property values across New Mexico.
