Trees have a tremendous impact on local economies and our quality-of-life.

Here's a peek at how urban trees in your state are contributing.



38,657 people are employed as a result of urban forestry activities in Texas.



Communities in Texas enrolled in Tree City USA® invested an

average of \$5.63 per

resident for tree planting and care compared to \$3.00 per

resident in non-participating communities nationally.



Urban trees in the state contribute **\$7.8 billion** in community-wide environmental benefits each year, such as carbon sequestration, air pollution removal, and avoided stormwater runoff.

The urban forestry sector in Texas has an annual sales and employment footprint

worth \$5.1 billion.



Tree cover at private homes adds

\$1.6 billion annually to property values across Texas.
